RITE of ELECTION for Berth Sumbou

At the heart of our Christian life is the understanding that each of us is called by God. We recall the words of Christ who said "You did not choose me, no I chose you". Not only does Christ choose, he calls us and knows us by name. This call is celebrated in Catholic cathedrals throughout our countries at the beginning of Lent each year

The Rite of Election is a significant step for those who want to be received into the Catholic Church - preparing to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist at Easter.

Today berth Sumbou will be among the elect of the archdiocese. As we affirm Berth and send her to the Cathedral she is asked to express her response here and now in the presence of the Church to this question "Do you wish to enter fully into the life of the Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist?" She will respond "I do."

The candidates then inscribe their names in the Book of the Elect. This signifies that they have heard God call their name and wish to respond to his call.

Adult Faith Formation Action Serving the needs of others in my home & family, in my church, in my city, and my world

Our Lady of Sorrows, through the work of the Adult Faith Formation Committee, is assisting parishioners in their ongoing faith development. We are committed to better utilizing technology and social media to meet the needs of deepening your faith and helping you live the Christian way of life every day. Statement 15 of the survey we took about faith formation asked you to examine how well you "live a life of service by caring for others and reaching out to those in need". Below are

some ways you can put this idea into practice. We ask you to consider engaging in one of the following activities in each of the four areas. If you take on more, that is just terrific. We also want to get feedback from you. As you go through these activities each week, we ask you to join our blog and let the community know how this is going for you.

Putting Faith Formation into Action During Lent Week One of Lent – How do I relate to my

Family?Consider one of the roles you have within your family. (Mother/Father,

Grandmother/Grandfather, Daughter/Son, Sister/Brother, Aunt/Uncle, Niece/Nephew, or Cousin). Here are two possibilities to consider.

For Lent, we have taken on the idea of moving from the "desert to an oasis." Perhaps when you examine the role you have as a family member, there is a desert, a gap between what the role is for you now and where you want it to be. You have hopes, ideals, and expectations of what you want to do in that role, but are not sure how to get there. You are looking for your oasis. Schedule some quiet time during one of the very first few days of Lent and engage in prayer with God. Have a conversation with God about this role you play. How does it fit in to caring for others and reaching out to those in need? What is God calling you to do? How could you put that into practice in one or two concrete ways during Lent? Create two expectations for yourself on what you want to do with your time to serve the needs of your family in this role. (Examples: I will make an effort to talk with my younger brother or sister, I will make a concerted effort each week to be patient with my son or daughter regarding homework, I will visit and spend quality time with my grandma, grandpa, granddaughter or grandson each

week.) Chart out how you will do this for the Lenten season.

An important part of family life is sharing meals. Perhaps there's somewhat of desert in how meals are taking place at home. Are family members talking and connecting or are they spending much of their time on their own, watching television, on the computer or cell phones. This in a way is a desert. Our meals should be shared experiences. Our Eucharist is a meal shared. Sharing a meal has been an essential part of the Christian faith since its beginnings. We have posted recipes on our website. Consider taking one recipe each week and making a meal with other members of the family. While you are engaged in the activity, make an effort to have all technology off (televisions, cell phones, computers and other electronic devices). Make an effort to make it a joyful occasion. It is not a time for complaining, asking for things, or criticizing. It is a time for sharing what is going on in the lives of each other. Then carry on the attitude when you sit down and enjoy what you have made. Before eating, take a moment to start with a prayer of gratitude. Ask each family member present to contribute to the prayer with words of thanks. At some point after the meal, visit the OLS website and write about your experience. You can remain anonymous or post your name. (For those living alone, perhaps we can encourage individuals to reach out and share a meal with another parishioner. Perhaps, if people who eat alone are interested, we could do one or two potluck meals at the O'brien Center) Make a concerted effort to engage in the activity you have selected throughout the weeks of Lent. Make an effort to pray in be in conversation with God after each of your activities.
